**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 213 ENTITLED "STREETS AND SIDEWALKS" OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BYRAM TO AMEND ARTICLE I ENTITLED "STREET EXCAVATIONS" TO ADD NEW SECTIONS 213-11A THROUGH 213-11D TO AUTHORIZE A DEADLINE FOR EXCAVATION OF NEWLY IMPROVED STREETS AND RIGHTS OF WAY.**

**Purpose Statement:** The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide written notice of street paving to owners of utility infrastructure located in or under affected streets and to provide a 45-day time limit for the completion of work in the road or right of way prior to the street paving.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Township of Byram, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, as follows:

**Section 1.** Article I entitled "Street Excavations" is amended to add the following new sections: 213-11A, 11B, 11C, and 11D

**Chapter 213. Streets and Sidewalks**

**§ 213-11A Notices of Street Paving and Repairs; Deadline.**

Whenever the Township Council enacts an ordinance or resolution providing for the paving or repaving of any street or sidewalk, the Municipal Clerk shall promptly mail a written notice thereof to each person owning sewers, mains, conduits, or other utilities, in or under said street or sidewalk. Such notice shall notify such persons that any application for an excavation permit for openings, cuts or excavations for work to be done in or under said street or sidewalk prior to such paving or repaving shall be submitted promptly in order that the work covered by such excavation permit may be completed not later than 45 days from the date of enactment of such ordinance or resolution. The Municipal Clerk shall also promptly mail copies of such notice to any governmental agencies or departments or other persons who may desire to perform excavation work in said street or sidewalk.

**§ 213-11B Performing repairs.**

Within said 45 days, every owner, person, agency or utility receiving notice as prescribed herein shall perform such excavation work subject to the provisions of this Article and Article III, as may be necessary to install or repair sewers, mains, conduits, utility installations or other work in said street or sidewalk. In the event any owner, person, agency or utility shall fail within said forty-five-day period to perform such excavation work, any and all rights of such owner, person, agency or utility or their successors in interest, to make openings, cuts or excavations in said street or sidewalk shall be prohibited and forfeited for a period of five years from the date of

enactment of said ordinance or resolution. During said five-year period, no excavation permit shall be issued to open, cut or excavate in said street or sidewalk unless in the judgment of the Township Manager, an emergency exists which makes it absolutely essential that the excavation be permitted. Any excavation granted by the Township Manager under this subsection shall be conducted in accordance with the standards set by the Township Engineer.

**§ 213-11C Time period.**

Every Township department or official charged with responsibility for any work that may necessitate any opening, cut or excavation in said street or sidewalk is directed to take appropriate measures to perform such excavation work within said forty-five-day period so as to avoid the necessity of making any openings, cuts or excavations in the new pavement in the Township's streets or sidewalks during said five-year period.

**§ 213-11D Violations and penalties.**

Violations of the provisions of this article shall be punishable as provided in Chapter 1, §1-15 , General Penalty.

**Section 2 Repealer** All Ordinances of the Township of Byram which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**Section 3 Severability** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance

**Section 4. Effect** This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after adoption and publication as provided by law.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION A287-8 SEWER SYSTEM  
FEES OF THE BYRAM TOWNSHIP CODE REGARDING SEWER USER  
CHARGES AND MAINTENANCE FEES**

**Purpose Statement:** An Ordinance amending Section A287-8 Sewer System Fees of the Byram Township Code lowering the Per Equivalent Dwelling Unit (EDU) commencing January 1, 2017 to \$274.00 per quarter.

**WHEREAS,** the Byram Township's sanitary sewer system services the approved sewer service area that includes Byram Township school, the Municipal Complex, the Route 206 corridor from the corner of Lackawanna Drive south to Acorn Street, and various residential users; and

**WHEREAS,** expenses in connection with debt service, operation and maintenance of the sanitary sewer system dictate the rates paid by users to satisfy said costs; and

**WHEREAS,** Byram Township pays annual fees to the Musconetcong Sewerage Authority for the allocation of sewer gallons to Byram Township; and

**WHEREAS,** the Musconetcong Sewer Authority has reported a reduction in debt service from Phase 1 and 1A capital improvements, which resulted in a reduction of the Township's annual fees to the Musconetcong Sewer Authority; and

**WHEREAS,** the auditor of the Musconetcong Sewer Authority informed Byram Township that the reported reduction described above will constitute a permanent reduction of the debt service unless there is a future significant capital improvement; and

**WHEREAS,** Musconetcong Sewer Authority annually provides the calculated Musconetcong Sewer Authority Municipal Charges annual fees in January based on its adopted budget; and

**WHEREAS,** as a result of the reduction of the Musconetcong Sewer Authority annual fees the Township is reducing the sewer user charges five (5%) percent effective January 1, 2017; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED,** by the Byram Township Council of the Township of Byram, Sussex County, New Jersey, that Section A287-8 of the Code of the Township of Byram, shall be and is hereby amended as follows:
