TOWN-WIDE WINTER REMINDERS

LEAF PICK-UP: The second and FINAL leaf pick-up is scheduled during the first full week of December. Leaves must be bagged in biodegradable paper bags available at most hardware stores. We have some at the town hall for 50 cents each, until supplies run out.

WINTER PARKING: It's that time of year again! Please help the Police and the DPW by following the guidelines in the Township Ordinances and keeping everyone safe. L.O. 230-17 takes effect week of November 1, 2009 and remains in effect until April 15, 2010.

- ❄ Parking is prohibited in all Township Parks between sunset and sunrise. (Ord. #182-4)
- ❄ Parking, standing and stopping is prohibited in fire zones in front of all stores in the Byram Plaza. (Ord. #230-16)
- ❄ Parking is prohibited on most Township streets when snow-covered. (Exceptions are in Ord. #230-56)
- ❄ Parking is prohibited on most Township streets November 1 through April 15 from 2:00 a.m. - 6:00 a.m. (Exceptions are listed in Ord. #230-46)
- ❄ Parking a vehicle for sale is prohibited in the B-1 zone located along Route 206. (Ord. #230-59)
- ❄ Parking is prohibited in the Cranberry Lake Park and Ride between midnight and 5:00 a.m. (Ord. #230-58)

DISCOVERING THE BEAUTIES OF FALL ON BYRAM'S TRAIL SYSTEM

As the air begins to chill and the last bits of summer drift away, Fourth of July fireworks are replaced by the natural beauty of fall leaves and we are drawn to the marvels of the woods. Byram Township trails provide access to vast open public spaces, and we are continually working to improve and enlarge the trail system.

New trails are being developed on various sites throughout the Township; and old trails are being modified, as are their usage rules. Some of those changes are described here and in the link below to an Environmental Commission presentation about the Byram trail system.

Please note that hunting season closure rules have changed on sections of the Highlands Trail that traverse the Hudson Farm property, so that no access is permitted from October 1st through January 31st. As on all trails, please obey the signs posted at the trailheads and stay on the designated routes.

Also note that new trails are being developed on the Beckmann property between Cranberry and Johnson Lakes thanks to the help of local scouts. The Environmental Commission, in conjunction with the Open Space Committee and Recreation office, is also developing a trail on the recently acquired Arnell property just south of Lake Mohawk. Stay tuned for updates as these trails are completed and opened to the public.

RECYCLING INFORMATION

LOCATION: 10 Mansfield Drive, Byram Township

Open Wednesdays 7:30 a.m. - 2:00 p.m., Saturdays 7:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

THE TOWNSHIP RECYCLING CENTER ACCEPTS ALL RECYCLABLE ITEMS: METAL, AUTO TIRES WITHOUT RIMS, AND MAJOR APPLIANCES (REMOVE REFRIDGERATOR DOORS). NO CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL.

- 1. CURBSIDE RECYCLING:** Once a month per schedule. Items can be co-mingled but must be in a reusable container, not a plastic or paper bag or box. Mix together food cans, glass food and beverage jars and bottles, and plastic soda, water, juice and detergent containers ONLY. Items should be rinsed clean and labels removed from cans. Paper goods: newspapers, magazines, junk mail, office paper, and all cardboard can be mixed together in a reusable container or tied with string.
- 2. TRASH COLLECTION:** Once a week per schedule. Trash should go out the night before pickup day. Trash cans larger than 33 gallons will not be picked up.
- 3. Bulky Waste:** Collected curbside on regular trash pickup day (carpeting, furniture, mattresses, televisions). No metal, major appliances (e.g. refrigerators, stoves), tires, constructions material or hazardous material. Only put out a few items each week. If you are emptying several rooms in a house, you must pay for a dumpster.
- 4. LEAF DUMP:** Located at 10 Mansfield Drive. Leaf dump will close this year on December 12th, 2009. and the last day for accepting brush is October 31st, 2009. Hours are as follows: Wednesdays and Saturdays, 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. No commercial accounts accepted. Brush is only accepted and must be 4" or less in diameter (no stumps, roots or old firewood). Do not rake leaves or shovel snow into street!
- 5. CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS AND HAZARDOUS WASTE:** Sheet rock, wood, concrete, shingles, etc., motor oil and hazardous wastes must be brought to the Sussex County Landfill, Route 94, Lafayette, (973) 579-6998.
- 6. CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP:** The week of January 11th, 2010, weather permitting. Place trees curbside for pickup. Please remove all tinsel and decorations.

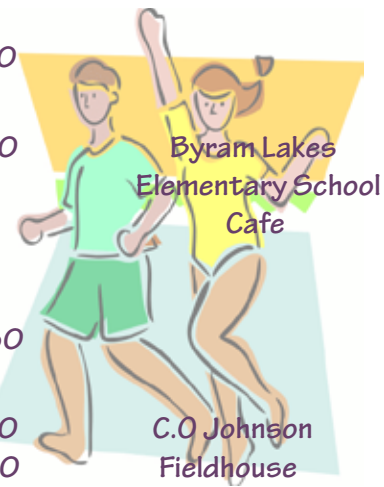
