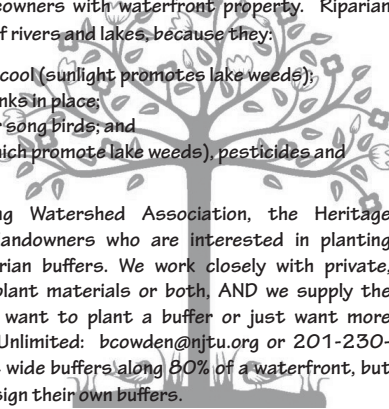
ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION'S CORNER:

FREE PLANTING OF WATERSIDE BUFFERS OFFERED!

Byram's Environmental Commission and Trout Unlimited are partnering to offer free riparian (waterside) buffers to interested homeowners with waterfront property. Riparian buffers are very important for the overall health of rivers and lakes, because they:

- o provide shade to keep the river or lake cool (sunlight promotes lake weeds);
- o establish root systems to hold the banks in place;
- o supply excellent habitat, especially for song birds; and
- o help prevent runoff from fertilizers (which promote lake weeds), pesticides and excess soil from entering the water.

Trout Unlimited, the Musconetcong Watershed Association, the Heritage Conservancy, and various partners seek out landowners who are interested in planting native trees and shrubs to provide good riparian buffers. We work closely with private, state and federal agencies to obtain funding, plant materials or both, AND we supply the volunteers to do the actual plantings! If you want to plant a buffer or just want more information, contact Brian Cowden from Trout Unlimited: bcowden@njtu.org or 201-230-3383. Byram's ordinances recommend 10-foot wide buffers along 80% of a waterfront, but homeowners can work with Trout Unlimited to design their own buffers.

WEEKLY SUMMER PROGRAMS

Byram Parks and Recreation offers a number of week-by-week summer programs for ages 4 through 18. Below are descriptions of the basic programs, followed by specific programs offered, broken down by age groups with pricing. Each age group has a full day's worth of activities outlined in time brackets and are offered for the six noted weeks. Sign up for particular programs separately or sign up for an entire day filled with on-going fun and learning and receive a package discount!



MORNING PROGRAM, SUMMER INITIATIVES:

The Summer Initiatives program is designed for children from preschool (4 year olds) to young teens entering 9th grade. The activities of this program provide social, mental, and physical growth in a safe and fun environment. Kids will engage in organized activities with their peers under the guidance of teachers and counselors. Certified teachers will lead daily activities, which include games & physical activities, arts and crafts, music, theatre arts, hands-on science, and other activities. Children will also have time to explore individual interests. Trips, theme days, special events and snack times are all included.

There are six, one-week, sections offered. Children may enroll for one or all sessions. Dates and types of trips for each session are described below, within each age group. Permission slips, medical and release forms must be completed. Children should bring a snack each day and wear laced-up athletic shoes. The fun begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends by 1:00 p.m. every day during each session, unless otherwise noted. All sessions are held in the Byram Civic Center, located at 55 Lackawanna Drive, Byram.

AFTERNOON ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS (AGES 4-14):

Afternoon Enrichment programs give kids the chance to concentrate, in depth, on an area of interest. Teachers for these programs are experts in their fields and class sizes are kept small for maximum participation. A list of enrichment programs and dates offered are described below for each age group.

Programs run each afternoon, starting by 1:30 p.m. (12:30 p.m. for the preschool and kindergarten age groups). Please send a snack. All programs conclude at 4:30 p.m. (1:30 p.m. for the preschool and kindergarten age groups; see their time brackets). All programs will be held at the Civic Center, in Byram, except for tennis and basketball. Tennis will be held at the Municipal Building Tennis Courts and basketball will be held in the Byram Schools.



BEFORE, LUNCH, AND AFTER HOURS CARE:

Need an earlier start or a later pick-up time? No problem! The fun-filled, full day packages (listed in the appropriate age categories) include before, lunch, and after hours care! The before and lunch care may only be signed up for with enrollment in Summer Initiatives. The after hours care may only be signed up in addition to enrollment in Afternoon Enrichment, for grades 1 through 9, or Afternoon Antics, for preschoolers and kindergarteners.

Early drop-off care before Summer Initiatives will begin at 7:30 a.m. until the start of the morning activities at 8:30 a.m. Lunch will begin after the Summer Initiatives program ends, for the day, at 1:00 p.m. (except for the preschool and kindergarten age group, which has its own time brackets; see this category on the following page) until 1:30 p.m., when the Afternoon Enrichment begins. The cost of before care is \$ 10 per week and the cost of lunch supervision is also \$ 10 per week. Each child should bring their own bagged lunch labeled with his or her name. After hours care will begin when Afternoon Enrichment ends at 4:30 p.m. and the last pick-up will be by 6:30 p.m. at the cost of \$ 20 per week.
