The New Jersey Department of Transportation cordially invites you to attend an informal Pre-construction Public Information Center regarding the Route 206, Waterloo /Brookwood Roads Intersection Improvements project in Byram Township, Sussex County.

The Pre-Construction Information Center is scheduled for **Tuesday, December 1, 2009 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.** in the Cranberry Lake Fire House, 225 Route 206, Andover, New Jersey. **Please plan to attend at a time that is convenient for you. Property owners of rental units are advised that tenants are invited and encouraged to participate.**

The purpose of the Pre-Construction Public Information Center is to introduce to the Public Officials and the general public the Department's Resident Engineer who will be overseeing the day-to-day construction as well as the State's contractor who will be doing the work.

The project includes 1.2 miles of improvements to Route 206, improved access to businesses, improved sight distance and drainage, the realignment of Waterloo Road with Brookwood Road, the relocation of Lackawanna Drive, colored and textured sidewalks, center and left turn lanes, decorative walls and railing at Lubbers Run, landscaping and street trees, "Gateway" areas, and pedestrian and bicycle passage under Route 206 at Lubbers Run for future trail connections.

Department representatives will be in attendance to answer questions and to explain the project. Maps and plans will also be available for the public's viewing.
