Joe stated that there were several full time administrative employees located in the municipal building along with a police department that has 14 full-time employees. The administrative departments have more part-time employees than full-time. He also referred Joann to the website that has all the information about the existing building and proposed building and many supporting documents. Joann asked when would Tamarack Park open. Joe stated that it was possible it could be this fall, but more likely that it would be spring of 2017.
