# Prescribed Burning in New Jersey

A Procedure and Application Guide for Other Government Agencies:

Forest Fire Service-Implemented Prescribed Burns for County, Municipal, Municipal Authorities and any State Affiliated College or University

NOTE: Use this application if you are requesting services from the New Jersey Forest Fire Service (NJFFS) to plan and implement a prescribed burn on your behalf. If you are conducting the burn yourself or wish to hire a qualified professional other than the NJFFS use the applications titled: Landowner-Implemented Prescribed Burns or Qualified Professional-Implemented Prescribed Burns

#### Section I. When should a landowner undertake prescribed burning?

Prescribed burning can be a safe and cost-effective method of reducing fuels, vegetation and leaf litter that could contribute to a wildfire, across a broad landscape. Forest landowners or lessees (also known as "applicants" or "applicant") should consider whether prescribed burning could be used as a management tool to reduce fuels if:

- There exists a heavy fuels accumulation and the woodland is vulnerable to wildland fire; and
- The burn will help to reduce wildfire risk.

However, no applicant should employ prescribed burning as a land management tool if:

- Such burning is prohibited by local ordinance;
- The applicant lacks the resources and skills necessary to carry out and complete the burn safely;
- The potential burn site is not accessible for fire vehicles and equipment.

N J Department of Environmental Protection's Air Quality regulations, N.J. A. C. Chapter 27, Subchapter 2 define the Control and Prohibition of Open Burning. Permits are required to conduct prescribed burning and are obtained from NJ Forest Fire Service. There are three options an applicant can chose to implement a prescribed burn on the applicant's property:

- Obtain a permit to implement him or herself
- Request the services of the NJ Forest Fire Service (FFS) staff
- Hire a qualified professional

Note. This application procedure and guide is intended for applicants who wish to request the services of the NJ Forest Fire Service staff to plan, prepare, and implement a prescribed burn and is known as a "Forest Fire Service Implemented Prescribed Burn for Other Government Agencies Application." This is not a valid application for any Federal Government Agency.

#### Section II. Prescribed Burning Permits: Application Procedure

To apply for a prescribed burning permit

- "Landowners" includes landowners or lessees and their employees and/or designated agents
  who are conducting burns on the landowners' properties can apply for the permit.
   Responsibility for the proper conduct of the burn resides with the applicant.
- Complete an application (Section III, Appendices A and B) and send to one of the three FFS
   Division Field Offices (Appendix C) by October 1<sup>st</sup>.
- There is no fee associated with applying for a permit.

Note. A new application will be required each year regardless of what was completed or not completed. The agreement to render services is only valid for that prescribed burn season ending June 30th 2019.

#### **Forest Fire Service Implemented Prescribed Burns**

To apply for a FFS Implemented Prescribed Burn Permit, the applicant shall, by October 1st:

- a. Complete and sign the application form (Section III), Prescribed Burn Permit Conditions (Appendix A), and the Prescribed Burning Agreement (Appendix B); and
- b. Submit the completed forms to the appropriate Division Field Office (see Appendix C).

#### PRESCRIBED BURNING AGREEMENT

#### A. The Applicant:

- 1. Requests that the FFS perform the prescribed burn(s) on the property specified above.
- 2. Accepts full responsibility for any and all injury and/or damages to the applicant's property that may result from the burn operation.
- 3. For the applicant, and the applicant's heirs, successors and assigns, holds harmless, indemnifies, defends, protects, and releases the State of New Jersey, the Department of Environmental Protection, and their members, directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, successors, and assigns from and against any and all suits, causes of action, demands, complaints, liabilities, penalties, costs, losses, damages, judgments, expenses or claims, including, without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees, in any form, arising from or in any way connected with the FFS' role in the prescribed burn.
- 4. Understands and acknowledges that prescribed burning assistance from FFS is limited depending on resource availability.
- 5. Understands and acknowledges that the highest priority for FFS personnel and equipment assigned for use in the prescribed burn remains the suppression of wildland fire and that fire suppression will take precedence over prescribed burn activities. The applicant recognizes that the prescribed burning may be suppressed at any time during the operation if the fire is too destructive or hazardous or if the potential or actual danger from wildfire on the property or elsewhere reaches the point where FFS personnel and equipment must suppress the prescribed burn fire until it is fully contained, even though the burn is incomplete, and return to firefighting activities.
- 6 Understands and acknowledges that the purpose and objectives of the prescribed burn are set forth in the Prescribed Burn Plan, and that the burn may be suppressed and discontinued at any time during the operation if the FFS determines that the fire is not fulfilling the purpose of the burn, as set forth in the plan.
- 7. Will observe the forest fire laws and conform with any constraints applicable pursuant to the air pollution regulations of New Jersey pertaining to the prescribed burning operation.

#### B. The FFS:

- 1. In consultation with the applicant, will prepare a Prescribed Burn Plan for the prescribed burn.
- 2. Will prepare, as necessary, interior and/or exterior fire control lines, sufficient to prevent the escape of fire from the burn area.

- 3. Provide a supervisory FFS employee and necessary hand tools and equipment during the prescribed burning operation at no cost to the applicant.
- 4. Will provide necessary personnel to patrol and safeguard the burned area until the burn is complete and considered 100 percent contained.
- 5. Will prepare and file the Accomplishment Report for the burn.

NOTE:

The FFS will exercise the necessary skill and responsible care in performing the prescribed burn, but gives no warranty, expressed or implied, as to the effectiveness of the prescribed burning operation.

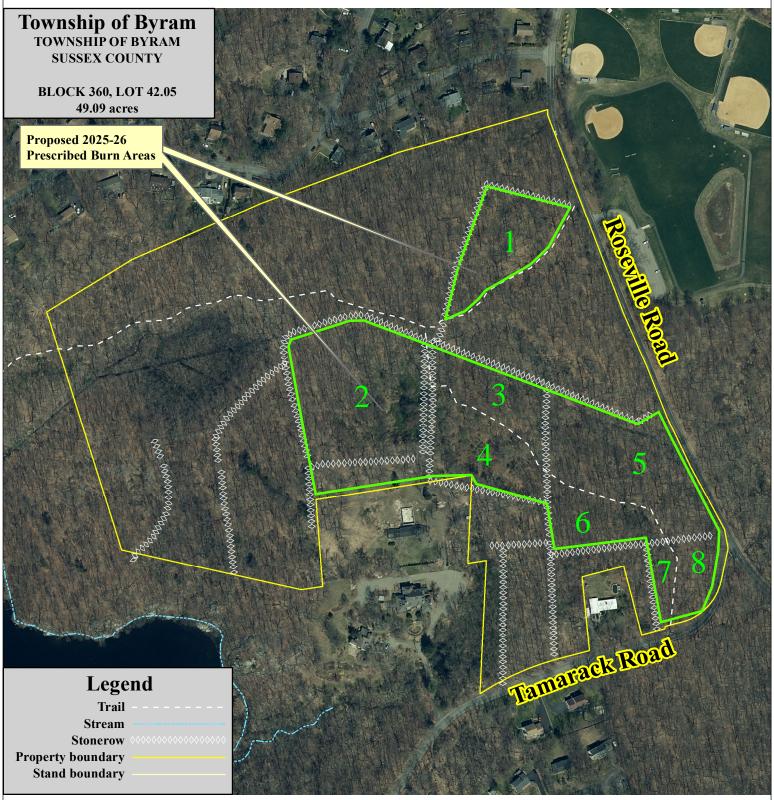

WHEREAS, Township of Byram Open Space Committee and Environmental Commission recommend the implementation of a NJFFS prescribed (controlled) burn in the northeast section of Tamarack Park to address the severe infestation of Japanese barberry (Berberis thunbergii), an aggressive invasive plant that poses significant ecological and public health risks; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Township Council of the Township of Byram does hereby authorize the controlled burn to manage invasive barberry at Tamarack Park.

# AN ORDINANCE OF BYRAM TOWNSHIP AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF A PORTION OF BLOCK 331, LOT 6, OWNED BY THE TOWNSHIP AND NOT REQUIRED FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES, BY PRIVATE SALE, TO THE CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY OWNER

**WHEREAS**, the Local Lands and Buildings Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12-1 <u>et seq.</u> authorizes local governments to sell municipally owned land not needed for public use, at private sale, to the owner of contiguous property, provided said property is less than the minimum size required for development under the municipal zoning ordinance and is without capital improvements thereon; and

WHEREAS, Byram Township has a claim of ownership to a portion of Lot W-32 depicted on "Map No. 3 Revised, Weaver House Cove, Cranberry Lake Summer Colony, Cranberry Lake, N.J. dated May 25, 1923" and filed with the Sussex County Clerk as Map No. 110B; and

WHEREAS, the Owner of adjoining Block 125, Lot 33, being known as Lot W-33 and the strip of land adjoining the westerly line of W-33, ten feet in width paralleling the dividing line between Lots W-33 and W-22 and being the easterly portion of W-22, as shown on Map No. 110B, has a claim of ownership to a portion Lot W-32 consisting of a strip of land containing approximately 1,765 square feet situated between the boundary line of Block 125, Lot 33 and the canal bulkhead, inclusive thereof, as depicted on a survey entitled "Map of Property 127 North Shore Road Lot 33 Block 125 & Lot 37 Block 124" prepared by Alfred A. Stewart, Jr. dated March 9, 2023, last revised May 5, 2025 ("Subject Area"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Subject Area has been in the possession of and used exclusively, openly, notoriously, visibly, continuously, and uninterrupted by Owner since September 27, 1968, and no one has ever questioned Owner's use or occupancy of said property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township and Owner desire to finally resolve any and all disputes regarding title to the Subject Area; and

WHEREAS, the Township and Owner are the only real property owners contiguous to the Subject Area; and

**WHEREAS**, the Subject Area is less than the minimum size required for development under the Township's Zoning Ordinances and without capital improvements which may be necessary and incidental to the lawful performance of any function of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Owner has offered to purchase the Subject Area for \$2,500.00; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined that the Subject Area is not needed for public use, and given the unique circumstances regarding its historical ownership and use, it is in the Township's best interest to convey any and all interest it may have to the Subject Area to the contiguous Owner; and

**WHEREAS**, upon final passage of this ordinance, the Owner shall apply to the Township Land Use Board for a subdivision/lot line adjustment of the Subject Area which shall then be merged by deed with Block 125, Lot 33.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Township Council, Township of Byram, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. The Subject Area, as depicted on a survey entitled "Map of Property 127 North Shore Road Lot 33 Block 125 & Lot 37 Block 124" prepared by Alfred A. Stewart, Jr. dated March 9, 2023, last revised May 5, 2025, shall be sold to the Owner of Block 125, Lot 33 by private sale in the amount of \$2,500.00, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12-1 et seq and the Township's authority to settle claims subject to the following conditions:
- a. The Owner shall apply to the Township Land Use Board within 180 days of publication of this Ordinance for a subdivision/lot line adjustment of the Subject Area which shall be then be merged by deed with Block 125, Lot 33.

- b. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after adoption and publication according to law.
- c. The Township Attorney is authorized to prepare the necessary documents to convey the Subject Area to the Owner Block 125, Lot 33.
- d. The Mayor and Township Clerk are authorized to sign the necessary documents to effectuate the intent and purpose of this Ordinance.
- 2. **Severability.** If any part of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of the Ordinance. Any ordinance or portion thereof that may be inconsistent with the ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.
- 3. **Repealer.** All existing Ordinances and/or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistency, repealed.
- 4. **Effect.** This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after notice of publication in accordance with law.

### TOWNSHIP OF BYRAM ORDINANCE # 013-2025

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BYRAM AMENDING SECTION 133 ENTITLED "FIRE PREVENTION" TO AMEND AND REPLACE IT IN ITS ENTIRETY

Purpose Statement: The purpose of this ordinance is to update and amend the Chapter 133 to amend it and replace it in its entirety to facilitate a shared service with Hardyston Township.

Now THEREFORE, be it ordained as follows:

Section 1. Section 133 entitled "Fire Prevention" is amended in its entirety to state as follows:

#### §133-1 Local Enforcement of Uniform Fire Code.

Pursuant to Section 11 of the Uniform Fire Safety Act, the New Jersey Uniform Fire Code shall be enforced locally in the Township of Byram.

Editor's Note: See N.J.S.A. 52:27D-202.

#### §133-2 Designation of the Local Enforcing Agency.

- A. The local enforcing agency shall be the Hardyston Township Bureau of Fire Prevention, which shall be hereinafter known as the local enforcing agency pursuant to a shared services agreement, Effective July 1, 2025, between the Township of Byram and the Township of Hardyston, which is incorporated by reference herein. A copy of said agreement is on file in the municipal clerk's office.
- B. The local enforcing agency established by this article shall be created and supervised by the Township of Hardyston and shall meet all of the requirements of the applicable law and regulations.
- C. The chief administrative officer of the local enforcing agency shall be a state-licensed fire official appointed by the governing body of the Township of Hardyston consistent with the procedures set forth in the applicable law and regulations. The governing body of the Township of Hardyston may appoint fire inspectors and other employees of the enforcing agency consistent with applicable laws and regulations. All inspectors shall be licensed by the state.

#### §133-3 Duties of Enforcing Agency.

The local enforcing agency shall enforce the Uniform Fire Safety Act and the codes and regulations adopted in all buildings, structures and premises within the established boundaries of the Township of

Byram, other than owner-occupied one- and two-family dwellings, and shall faithfully comply with the requirements of the Uniform Fire Safety Act and the Uniform Fire Code.

#### §133-4 Life-Hazard Uses.

The local enforcing agency shall carry out the periodic inspections of life-hazard uses as required by the Uniform Fire Code on behalf of the Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs.

#### §133-5 Non-Hazard Uses.

In addition to the registrations and permits required by the Uniform Fire Code, all other uses subject to Uniform Fire Code inspections shall register with the local enforcing agency prior to commencing operation of the non-life-hazard use. A penalty shall accrue, in addition to the registration fee, if a nonlife-hazard use is not so registered prior to commencing operation. The non-life-hazard use shall thereafter be registered annually during the month of January. A late registration penalty shall be assessed on February 1 for failure to register in accordance with the fee schedule below. Late registrations in excess of 90 days will be referred to the Township Attorney for collection.

#### §133-6 Permit and Application Fees.

#### Non-Life-Hazard Use Registration Fees:

All occupancies 500 or less square feet: \$50.00 All occupancies between 501 and 9,999 square feet \$100.00 All occupancies 10,000 or more square feet: \$200.00

#### Penalty for non-registration of non-life-hazard use:

Thirty days overdue: amount equal to unpaid fee.

Sixty days overdue: \$250.

#### Certificate of smoke alarm, carbon monoxide alarm, and portable fire extinguisher compliance (CSACMAPFEC) / Smoke Certificates

Requests received more than 10 days prior to closing/change of occupancy: \$100.00 Requests received 4 to 10 business days prior to closing/change of occupancy: \$150.00 Requests received fewer than 4 business days prior to closing/change of occupancy: \$200.00

Any required re-inspections: \$50

#### Permits.

Permit fees are specified under N.J.A.C. 5:70-2.9

#### §133-7 Appeals.

Pursuant to the Uniform Fire Safety Act any person aggrieved by any order of the local enforcing agency shall have the right to appeal to the Sussex County Construction Board of Appeals. Editor's *Note: See N.J.S.A.* 52:27D-206 and 52:27D-208, respectively.

#### §133-8 Enforcement, Violations and Penalties.

Enforcement, violations, and penalties shall be managed in conformity with the Uniform Fire Safety Act, the Uniform Fire Code and all other laws of the State of New Jersey.

Editor's Note: See N.J.S.A. 52:27D-207 through 52:27D-211

**Section 3. Severability.** If any part of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of the Ordinance. Any ordinance or portion thereof that may be inconsistent with the ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.

**Section 4. Repealer.** All existing Ordinances and/or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistency, repealed.

**Section 5. Effect.** This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after notice of publication in accordance with law.

RE: 2026 Municipal Budget – Goals and Objectives

The Manager and staff prepare recommendations in the form of a draft budget document, and the Council must ensure that the adopted budget satisfies the needs of the community and serves the best interests of the Township. The approval and adoption of the Municipal Budget includes the budgets for the Open Space Tax and the Sewer Utility.

The 2026 Budget Process has started with the Township Department Heads. The Department Heads received the following instructions for their 2026 budget requests:

- 1. Each sub-account in the department's operating budget starts at zero.
- 2. Provide detailed justification of each sub-account identifying the good or service requested with budgeted expense.
- 3. No increase from the 2025 budget is expected and we should be targeting any reduction in the budget that can be sustained.
- 4. Populate the "2026 Requested" column with the total for each sub-account.
- 5. Identify any discretionary spending or other spending that can be cut from the budget. Prepare a summary of the impact of the reductions.
- 6. Meetings will be scheduled in September with each department head to review the budget requests.

CFO and Manager will populate Salary and Wage lines. All Collective Bargaining Agreements expire at the end of 2026. Administrative Employee salaries will be updated to support a 2% increase for 2026.

The municipal budget is the Council's most important annual policy statement. It defines how the local government team will implement its priorities for the next fiscal year, and where the money will come from to execute the plan. The budget is,

- A statement of priorities for the community
- A management blueprint for providing services
- The document that translates policies into action
- A tool for protecting the government's long-term financial health
- A communication document for the public.

The Mayor and Council should identify the goals and objectives for 2026 to identify resources including funding needs to execute the plan. It is critical to link policies and money through the annual budget.

It is planned that all budget meetings will be done as advertised meetings of the Mayor and Council. I am planning for the first budget meeting to be scheduled for the fall. The staff is prepared to support as many budget workshops as the Mayor and Council need to support adoption of the budget in early 2026.

#### Mayor and Council individual goals and objectives for 2026

#### Mayor Rubenstein:

- 1. As we have seen, drainage systems continue to be an area of concern in the town, with increased instances of failure of aging infrastructure. I'd like to see an increase in the annual allocation for repairs and improvements.
- 2. Clothing allowance. This does not have to be al large amount of money, but it sure would be nice for the Township to supply maybe a polo shirt and/or tee shirt with the town logo on it to wear at the workplace from time to time. I know now that most of the staff (myself included) by these items from our own pockets. I feel that there should be some level of allowance here. Many of us are proud that we work for or represent the town, it would be nice to have something to wear to show it.
- 3. 2026 for me would be the beginning of substantial improvements at CO Johnson Park. Specifically, refurbishment of the field house, replacement of the football announcer booth, walking path improvements, WiFi and cameras, better storage facilities for sporting clubs, and so forth. I know a lot of this is reliant on the pending DEP application, but it would seem some of these projects could get started and completed in 2026.
- 4. Continuing technology enhancements in the office. I would like to see further adoption of the available technologies to us to continue to modernize how we store and interact with our data and documents. This includes digitization of older documents, stronger and more efficient usage of could services, and so forth.

#### Councilman Roseff:

- 1. Roads need increased immediate attention. There should be a major shift in CapEx spending from buying vehicles and equipment to roads. Some time ago, Byram returned to an oil/stone style maintenance program for parts of our community. This approach has extended the life of the old asphalt pavement but the need for new paving is increasingly clear. Some of our roadwork has also been delayed due to gas line installation which now necessitates a steeper addressment ramp up. In recent periods, we have significantly renewed and enhanced our Police and DPW vehicle fleet and equipment. It is time for a strong shift in focus towards roadwork.
- 2. Some stormwater improvements should be planned for. The State has increased focus on stormwater infrastructure, and we have some projects outlined in the Lake Management Study.
- 3. Let's increase pursuit of grant opportunities, be they State, Federal or other, for road and stormwater improvements.
- 4. The current level of fund balance is well above what is needed and while it may be reduced somewhat from the capital improvements that have been authorized or planned it should be reduced further. We have taxed our residents, and they should see a return on this taxation.
- 5. For 1 year, provide materials and hire some craftsmen for only seasonal help for DPW to demo the interior of the Field House and improve its functionality. This is not a huge project request requiring all sorts of engineering help. We may also want to invite volunteers.
- 6. We have received large revenue flows from earned interest on our reserve balances, but this may not continue at this level. A goodly chunk of our various reserve balances are from the extraordinary gifts we received that are being spent down on various CapEx projects. Also, a conservative view of the next year or two would forecast lower interest rates. This line item should be anticipated to shrink substantially. We need to offset this by not increasing our overhead costs.
- 7. There is no reason that park improvements should lead to increased taxes. Let's make sure we keep our promise to fund these improvements through the current level of the Open Space tax.
- 8. Before entering into employee union contract discussions, we need to better understand our management options for employee health benefits. We should hire a consultant for parts of this work.
- 9. While it is not a direct budget issue for next year, there is risk that the State DOT work at the Andover Tunnel will kick off a time period where auxiliary Township roads will be more heavily used by cars and trucks. We should make sure, and get written commitments, that the State is committed to repairing and repaving these impacted roads as part of the overall Andover Tunnel repair budget.

#### Councilwoman Franco:

- 1. Streets and roads getting back on track
- 2. Municipal Building I have not given up yet
- 3. CO Johnson Park plans dog park and circular road path
- 4. CO Johnson Building perhaps a possibility for grant to update the structure

- 5. East Brookwood The Well House and Pump Station on Brookwood Road Neighbors are getting impatient with the lack of paving and building progress. The property is very sloppy, and we need to push Veolia/EPA to continue to keep the lot neat. I realize it is a "construction project", but for it to constantly be an eyesore is not right.
- 6. Entrance to Forest Lakes Drive from Rt 206 as well as the preparations for the Pequest construction zone.

#### Councilman Gallagher:

- 1. Work on the roads and infrastructure.
- 2. Like to see us upgrade the fieldhouse building at CO along with the building at NG field.

#### Councilman Proctor:

- 1. COJ Improvements
- 2. Fieldhouse Upgrade Renovations and modernization to improve community usability. Meeting Space?
- 3. Road Maintenance and Improvement Program Continue to effectively utilize the 10yr improvement plan. Maybe refresh PCI survey?
- 4. Police Department Upgrade If we are going to see this project through, we should do so in a fiscally responsible manner
- 5. Finance Department and Meeting Room Planning Determine potential relocation plan
- 6. Seek and utilize available grants to offset local costs for capital initiatives
- 7. Maintain strong fund balance to support fiscal stability and emergency preparedness. Decrease dependency for capital projects.
- 8. Limit municipal tax increases while sustaining service levels
- 9. Continue shared services exploration with regional partners to reduce costs
- 10. Determine and act on best ways to combat SHBP increases

#### Current ordinance(s):

Setback of building from existing lakes, ponds, streams or wetlands shall be a minimum of (R1: 100 feet, R2: 75 feet, R3-5: 50 ft) measured from the one-hundred-year flood line. This setback shall include a ten-foot-wide vegetated buffer along at least 80% of the water's edge. (§ 240-50.1Requirements for all residential zones.)

#### EC Proposal 1: (see additions in **bold italics**)

Setback of building from existing lakes, ponds, streams or wetlands shall be a minimum of (R1: 100 feet, R2: 75 feet, R3-5: 50 ft) measured from the one-hundred-year flood line. This setback shall include a ten-foot-wide vegetated buffer of native, non-invasive vegetation along at least 80% of the water's edge, to the maximum extent practicable on such properties. Presence of a bulkhead does not eliminate or reduce the vegetated buffer requirement. Where a bulkhead is present, the buffer shall be located landward of the bulkhead, planted and maintained to filter runoff and stabilize soils.

#### EC Proposal 2: (see additions in **bold italics**)

Setback of building from existing lakes, ponds, streams or wetlands shall be a minimum of (R1: 100 feet, R2: 75 feet, R3-5: 50 ft) measured from the one-hundred-year flood line. This setback shall include a ten-foot-wide vegetated buffer of native, non-invasive vegetation along at least 80% of the water's edge, to the maximum extent practicable on such properties. Presence of a bulkhead does not eliminate or reduce the vegetated buffer requirement. Where a bulkhead is present, the buffer shall be located landward of the bulkhead, planted and maintained to filter runoff and stabilize soils.

Where compliance is impracticable due to lot size, preexisting conditions, or unique physical constraints, relief may be granted under the following conditions:

- 1. Where the full 100-foot setback is not available, the width of the vegetated buffer shall be at least 10% of the distance between the principal structure and the waterbody, but no less than 5 feet wide.
- 2. The required buffer coverage along the shoreline may be reduced to 50%, provided the remaining shoreline area is left undisturbed and no hardscaping or impervious surfaces are installed within the reduced buffer zone.

#### Other possible related recommendations?

- **1.** Prohibitions on fertilizer and pesticide use within the buffer, except for spot treatment of invasives.
- 2. Limits on impervious coverage.
