"IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF OUR LAKES WITH RAIN GARDENS"

Rain gardens are a way that we can all help to improve the water quality of our rivers, streams, and lakes. As the name suggests, these are gardens that capture water runoff from your roof, but they can also be used to capture water from your driveway and sump pump. Once the water reaches the rain garden, it is held there so that it can slowly filter back into the ground. In addition to recharging the groundwater supply, this helps to improve water quality by preventing fertilizer and roof pollutants from entering nearby waterways. The standing water is generally not a concern for a well constructed garden since the water will filter back into the ground in a few hours or days, and mosquitoes require 1-2 weeks of standing water to complete their lifecycle.

To construct a rain garden, your best bet is to start by selecting a low point in your property where water naturally drains. The garden is dug out 3 to 4 inches with care being taken to ensure a level bottom. To add to your garden's beauty, you should try to plant native flowers instead of grasses. While your plants are maturing, you may need to do some weeding during the first year. Once your rain garden has matured, it will require very little maintenance since the plants you have selected should crowd out most weeds.
